Rhonna was in sharing part of my table and told me she did not break any records. Charlie told me he sold a couple, at least, of his guns. Al Amundson bought one. So that made his day. I was too busy talking at my table so I didn't get a chance to ask around about business. I know Mike Hodgson started selling just after he arrived. Everyone I spoke to seemed happy. Of course, lots of folks take the opportunity of the show to wish a Merry Christmas to friends. I've always noticed a big crowd in December doing just that. I always thought that was one of the best parts of being a Club member and coming to shows.

Here's some bad news that was brought up at our meeting after the show. This is from the November show on Saturday, November 19. One of the members had some rifle magazines and a Crown Royal sack with \$1 and \$2 coins in the sack. All were in a plastic container under his table. Well, somehow on Sunday morning he couldn't find them! Maybe they got kicked out closer to the aisle and were picked up by someone, or heaven forbid, maybe some lowlife just stole the box. The mags were 2 Brno, 5 round, 2 Winchester 69, 5 round, 1 Remington 5 round, 1 Winchester M88-308 cal. and 1 Sako L46 in 222 Remington. I know its early news but there are folks who like to plan ahead. Yes, I'll have to take the blame for this oversight. It's me who checked the proof and said it was complete.

I'm just home from the first show of the year, January 15, 2012. I'm still in shock at the visitor turnout. This show is usually a moderate type show. This one was a record breaker. We had 285 guests! We've never had that many before, in fact, if we had 100 less I would think it was a good turnout. I don't know how the general sales were going because I didn't ask. I know I saw quite a few bags leaving. Charlie told me he preferred to buy stuff this show. So who am I to argue? All the tables were spoken for even the stage was full. Though it hurts me to report we had 3 people who booked and didn't show. In fact, they didn't call either Dave or me to say they couldn't make the show. them covered. Actually it's a big pain in the neck! Even worse news, one of our members suffered some medical distress and was taken to hospital in an ambulance. We've heard he's okay. So Gerrit Catterli, all the members are pulling for you. Another member who had to cancel because of a recent surgery was Bryan Morphy. He is sure to be okay by the February 12 show. We're expecting you Bryan, so make sure you're eating your "Wheaties". And that's an order! By now everyone knows Al Hollinger is in the hospital. From what I've heard he doesn't sound too good. On top of everything else he has developed pneumonia! However, Al is tough and he may very well beat that also. One last line on the show: I surely did enjoy myself even though I hardly got any sleep.
