Name tags will be the only participant identification, which **MUST be clearly displayed (worn) during set-up and show times.** Thank you for your co-operation. Show Committee, HACS of BC.

Trade Table

Trade tables rent for \$35 each. Trade tables are rented to sell firearms, militaria and collectables only. All items must comply with current laws.

Display Tables

Display tables rent for \$20 each. HACS judges adjudicate display tables and prizes are awarded to the top displays. No items may be sold from display tables. Displays must comply with all laws and HACS rules in regards to items displayed.

Security

24-hour security will be provided at the show. Please be aware that you are ultimately responsible for the security of your tables during show times. A receipt must be issued for any item sold with a value over \$10.

Participant Identification (total number of persons listed below includes the renter)

HACS will issue the following identity passes for participants named by the renter. First table – 2 persons. Second and subsequent tables – 2 persons. Maximum number of passes is for 4 persons, regardless of the number of tables over 2. Anyone found handing out participant identification to unidentified helpers or wearing someone else's participant identification will result in your removal from the show. The Show Committee reserves the right to remove any exhibitor who is disrespectful in any way to anyone, or who sets up tables that are deemed unsuitable for this show, or who refuses to abide by any of these rules.

Set-up Times

Set-up will be held between 3 pm – 9 pm on Friday, March 7, 2008 and 7 am – 9 am, Saturday, March 8, 2008. Set-up for very heavy articles such as gun safes will be held Friday from 1 pm – 3 pm. Drive in to unload and load.


Renters are not allowed to pack up before 3 pm on Sunday afternoon.
