SOCIETIES ACT

CONSTITUTION

- 1. The name of the Society is "H.A.C.S. HISTORICAL ARMS COLLECTORS SOCIETY OF BRITISH COLUMBIA".
- 2. The purposes of the Society are:
 - (a) to foster knowledge of firearms and other weapons, military and police uniforms, and related articles used by mankind throughout history for defensive or offensive purposes, and for hunting, and for personal protection.
 - (b) to encourage the study of those specimens and artifacts mentioned in paragraph (a) which remain in existence.
 - (c) to preserve intact for future generations those articles referred to in paragraph (a) which are now, or in the future may be, in the possession of members of the Society or other law-abiding citizens.
 - (d) to work for the establishment of a bonafide Museum of Weapons for the permanent display of the aforementioned articles.
 - (e) to encourage the general public to adopt a positive and cooperative attitude towards the possession or preservation of the articles mentioned in paragraph (a) on the part of law-abiding citizens.
 - (f) to educate the children of this nation regarding their heritage as it relates to the part played by the aforementioned weapons, firearms, etc. in the development of Canada, and the necessity for the continued protection of its sovereignty.
 - (g) to prevent, whenever possible, the acquisition of weapons of any type by persons of unsound mind, criminals, anarchists, subversives, or any other similar revolutionary individuals or groups.
 - (h) to oppose and prevent, by any legitimate means, the deliberate destruction of, or damage to weapons or firearms of significant historical importance by ignorant or irresponsible individuals, including government officials unaware of the consequences of their actions.
 - (i) to discourage restoration, changes, or alteration of the aftermentioned ED articles, by unskilled persons.
