## RON'S REPORT

Hello boys and girls. Here is another reminder about a room in Chilliwack over the March show. There are a lot of events going on besides our show, rooms get filled up fast. So again, here is the best deal we've been offered: the Coast Hotel, 45920 First Avenue, Chilliwack is offering our people a single or double rate of \$89 per night. Mention the gun show to get that rate when you phone the toll free number – 1.800.663.1144. Don't be disappointed! They also have an excellent dining room.

If you're coming to the November 19-20 show, and who isn't? You will be able to pay your 2012 Club dues. Dawn will be happy to issue a card out at the Club table.

As usual there will be NO newsletter in December! You have to remember what I'm telling you until January 2012. If you are a yearly table holder the December show is the one to pay for your tables. Here is the way it works. There are 9 one-day shows a year. If you pre-book your one-day tables you only pay for 8 shows. So the cost would be \$120 per table for the year. You are then assured the table you like for the whole year. We will also have the applications for tables for the March 10-11, 2012 Chilliwack show. The tables this year will be \$40 each. We had to increase the cost because of a slight rent increase and table costs. We're holding the space down to only 500 tables this year. Art and Gord say this will make the drive-in traffic flow much better. But, hey, we're all going to have a good time anyhow. Right?

I wonder if all of our members realize the unseen planning that has to be done for every show? Oh yes, everyone knows about table reservations and set up plans. They are there for everyone to see. There is a lot more to a successful show though including advertising and the relationship with your suppliers. I learned that a long time ago. You are going to need a favour once in a while. If you build a good relationship with the people who are supplying advertising, printing, hall rent and something few think about, security. We are extremely fortunate to have Al Amundson looking after security. He has built a relationship with a few good security people over the years who like working for us. Al pays them fairly yet not over the top. He makes sure if they come to Chilliwack from town he pays their gas. Al's bookkeeping is a bookkeepers dream. He has all the people's names on a sheet and their pay. He pays in cash and the people sign for their pay. Al then just hands the sheet over to Mike Wallace and it's already itemized and easy to follow. Did I remember to say how lucky we are to have Al and the precise method he uses? Thanks, Al! Another very precise member is Gord Bader. Gord does the table set up for Chilliwack. There is loads more to just designing the way the tables have to match reservations. He has a lot of fire marshal rules to take into consideration as well as working out the easiest way to get traffic flowing. Then he has to deal with the requests of the displayers as to where and how they like their tables. Also who they want to be beside and more important who they don't want to be beside! So again, we are very lucky to have Gord and his expertise with floor plans and tables. Thanks, Gord! This doesn't lessen the importance of all of the other people who put in a good deal of their time to make the Club what it is today. I could fill two whole newsletters talking about the really fine people we have in our Club. I'm certainly very proud to be associated with such a really outstanding group of boys and girls. I thank you all! You all make me look good as president. Thank you.

Well the November 19-20 show is history. But, what a show it turned out to be! On Saturday we broke a one-day attendance record. We had 263 paying visitors and nearly all of our members. Both of my daughters were in Saturday morning to let me walk around. However, I couldn't get out from behind my tables most of the time. I just had to talk to some members about show business and it was a struggle getting through the crowd. I think everyone had a smile on their face Saturday night. I know Charlie was happy because he sold a shotgun. Well, as a matter of fact, so did I or rather Rhonna sold it for me. I bought a few small things before the show started. After the doors opened it was impossible to get around to see anything. I even spoke to a man who was visiting from Ontario. He was very happy because I supplied a magazine for his rifle he had been looking for for two years. He enjoyed the show he was in again on Sunday. I don't think we will be able to count on him as a regular though. And, as you might expect, Sunday was slower although we did have 110 visitors. I saw a lot of guns leaving before lunch which made me think our people were having a good day again. On Saturday it was away too busy to notice how many guns were leaving. Also the crowd was so thick you really couldn't see more than people.

One of the big events for Sunday was the silent auction for the reloading set, a few gun parts and a box of tools that had all been donated. We raised approximately \$500 for the CKNW Orphans' Fund. The reloading set went to Gord Frost, tools went to John Simmer and I bought the gun parts. I think our 2011 donation to The Orphans' Fund is going to look fairly nice. You all realize when you donate to The Orphans' Fund, 100% of the donation goes to the kids. There is no paid staff getting the first cut of the money. The gun parts you ask? Well, I know I bought some gun parts, but I haven't looked at them to see exactly what I've bought. It's happened again! I spent more than I took in. Both of my daughters have warned me about doing that too. They tell me the bubble is going to burst soon if I don't stop spending like that. They just don't seem to understand how hard I try not to spend. But when some things come up for sale and they are so nice and shiny, how can I say no?

We've sure been lucky to have Catlyn working with her mother, Dawn, on the Club table at the show. I'm fairly sure they didn't get any time to have lunch Saturday. There was a beehive of activity around the table all of the time. Folks were paying dues, booking March tables, paying for November tables and paying for yearly tables all day. Anytime I looked out there it was a knot of people waiting to do one of the above. Tom was just as busy with visitors coming in paying admission and explaining about the silent auction. One of the boys came each day to look after the "walk around" security. I've forgotten who did which day but Matt came one day and Mitch came one day. I certainly want to take this opportunity to thank the whole Brown Family. They worked hard and did an excellent job for the Club! So, thanks to you all. We couldn't have survived without you!

Once again on Sunday morning the Lions Club put on a terrific breakfast for us. Everyone looks forward to it and we really appreciate the effort. Thanks very much!

At the directors' meeting after the show it was decided and voted on that there would be a committee put together for the March show. This is the committee: Chairman, Al Amundson, with members Art Hoivik, Gord Bader, Don Beebe and Jim Bennett.

Dave and I will just help the committee where we are asked to help. I'm quite happy with the committee. We should have done that a long time ago. I guess we're learning on the job. I'm happy to have a lot less responsibility. It had gotten so heavy that I really dreaded the March show approaching; now I look forward to the weekend.

By now you've noticed the addition of a poster and reservation application included with this newsletter. If you want tables for the March show, please fill out your application and bring it to the December 11 show or mail it in as early as possible. Remember we are holding the show down to only 500 tables this year so don't be disappointed by applying too late. The poster we are hoping you can display somewhere that a lot of people can see it, maybe even in your car window or your work place or any place a lot of people may be interested. Now remember also what I told you earlier – reserve your room in Chilliwack early! Dave stays at a bed and breakfast place there then talks the people into having a table at the show besides. How is that for merchandising?

Another topic was discussed at the directors' meeting, that was, our shows are getting a lot more publicity thanks in part to Ken & Pat Olychick posting it on their website as well as everything else we have working for us. So, we are going to start making use of the stage now at every show. There are new tables at the hall and they kept some of the wooden tables. So we have a few extra but if someone wants to bring their own table and have it on the stage, we will discount 1/3 of the rent. Also, Susanne, the cake lady, has agreed that she will be on the stage because she knows we are gun guys and gun tables come first on the floor. That is real class and she is a member of our Club also.

I'll see a lot of you boys and girls at the December 11 show. The ones I won't see there I'll take this opportunity to wish you all a Merry Christmas and a healthy, happy 2012. With that I'll sign off boys and girls. Remember, be good to each other.
