Friday I set up and dug out the magazines but left them behind the table on a chair or one of my tool boxes. We left about 6 p.m. to have our dinner. On Saturday I looked everywhere for the magazines. No luck! They were gone and there were no visitors in Friday at all. Things like this are disgusting. Our property should be safe wherever we leave it behind our tables! Then I had to explain to the gentleman why I didn't have any magazines for him.

Carey had a very serious heart attack earlier this spring and had to miss a few shows. Carey owns M & S Stocking out of Leader, Sask. As I was loading my truck I met Gordon Keller of Vancouver Island. I hadn't seen him for years. He is also into rusty old cars now as well as shotguns. He looked pretty well the same as always. Speaking of looking the same – Gary Freer was there also. I've know him for nearly 40 years. Would you believe this? He looks exactly the same as when I first met him in a show in the Empress Hotel. The ending of the dreaded Long Gun Registry has been the best thing that has happened in recent history. It is the first time in world history that draconian mandatory gun registration has been reversed, ended, dumped by any government worldwide.

A lot of credit for this goes to all of our combined efforts, a government firm in its commitments to the citizens that put them in power and most of all in my mind to CSSA and CILA who through Tony Bernardo propelled the government and the ministers to see this through. My had goes off to Tony, Terry Green and all of the other dedicated people at CSSA, CILA & NFA.

The Firearms people were there of course and they were keeping a close eye on the table holders to see that they were complying with the law. They are still hoping to bring about the old Liberal proposed gun show rules where all firearms have to be cabled to the table BUT we all know this is a pipe dream on their part as this government of the people will never let that happen. The Conservative govt. always used to postpone those proposed rules now they will dump them once and for all.

Now to the good service the Firearms people provide at Kamloops, the transfer and registration of restricted prohibits upstairs at the show. They also issue permits so the buyer can take the handgun home. This is a great service and a bonus to everyone attending the show.

Something I heard the Dalai Lama say in Ottawa the other day struck me as making very good sense: "The world belongs to people, not to governments and politicians." Don't you agree that's good common sense?

How many members watched the CBC news the other night and saw The Honourable Vic Toews speaking about the end of long gun registry? He looked very angry I thought as he said it had come to his attention that there were still CFOs attempting to collect point of sale data they are no longer authorized to collect after the passage of Bill C19. I won't copy everything he said but here is the last paragraph: "If it comes to your attention that CFOs are interpreting the Firearms Act as a basis for unauthorized data collection, please advise me immediately, I am prepared to consider all legislative and regulatory measures necessary to give effect to the will of Canadians." Yes, I managed to buy away more stuff than I thought I would. People just brought it over to me and demanded that I buy the stuff. What else could I do? I'm pretty sure most members moved a lot of stuff as I saw a lot of things going out the door. My daughter, Rhonna, sold more of her police things than she has sold for some time. I have only one theory on the crowd. First of all, we get used to seeing some folks who regularly attend shows. Not members, I'm speaking of visitors. This month there were a lot of folks who I've never seen at our shows before and they were glad to be there as well. Now my theory: we used to advertise in the "Buy and Sell" paper for every show. In April they quit publishing that paper just after our show. I contacted the "Now" newspaper chain and went over and worked out a deal with them. The sales lady was very helpful about pricing, ad size, ad publishing dates and even the size and colour of the ad. So I think we've hit a whole new market of collectors. Of course, Ken Olychick has been actively advertising the shows on the internet. This also is making a difference. Everyone in the show was sure the end of the idiotic long gun registration also had much to do with the enthusiasm, I'm sure.

Before we left the hall Sunday the June show tables are all spoken for and we have a waiting list. You have to think at least two months ahead now if you would like to rent a table.
