RON'S REPORT

At the volunteers' dinner Ray Stark told me of a very large show coming to Chilliwack June 22-24 at Heritage Park. It's called "Wild TV" Huntfest. It's apparently everything to do with hunting including ATVs, archery, demos, even a beer tent. I'll keep you informed on everything I learn about the program.

Now boys and girls here is another oversight to watch for on our newest calendar cards. They are the orange ones that go to March 8-9, 2014. Now look back at March 2013. It was so crowded on Saturday until 3 p.m. that I didn't get to say more than hello to anyone. I'm sure there were some

It was easy for me to notice as my tables are close to the hall entrance. This year Kevin had some husky young fellows there who helped load and unload. We all thanked them but there was only one piece left for Larry. I don't know if Shirley got lunch Saturday. Anyhow, thanks kids we sure enjoyed lunch. The firearms people were there as usual on a table upstairs. Anyone buying a handgun could go up and get a transfer done right away and get a permit to take it home also. That made it a lot more pleasant for both buyers and sellers. I've participated in every gun show ever held in Kamloops. So I've met lots of people. It's a real treat for me to touch base with them once a year. It's a very popular show and lots of HACS members participate and lots more just come to see the show. I don't think anyone goes away disappointed. For the table holders, I think everyone can make their expenses. Anyone in as a buyer has a very wide array of items to choose from. I always find quite a lot of items to buy, and I do! There were a few antiquers there but mostly gun people. From what I saw and heard, everyone sold. For anyone planning ahead, next year's dates are April 27-28. I've booked my tables in the "cold room" already.
