## RON'S REPORT

Hello again boys and girls. It's time for another piece of Club history. Are there any old timers still with us who remember C.M. Gatley? If you were his friend you got to address him as "Tats", if not, it was Mr. Gatley. He used to have a company in Vancouver that produced fishing lures and rods. I have no idea how old he was when he decided to "semi-retire". Then he moved to Salt Spring Island. He told me he only worked one month a year then. He had a small shop where he shut himself up for a month and made fly rods. During that time he had no contact with anyone but his wife. The rest of the year he played with double barrelled shotguns. He went to gun shows from here to Dallas, Texas where he had a good friend who shared his interest in shotguns. "Tats" would always buy English shotguns of quality or any of the parts. He thought it a windfall to find barrels. He was a real artist with all shotgun work. As he found barrels he would then fit them to actions. If they needed to be restocked he did that also. Everything he laid a hand to turned out to be perfect. He wouldn't leave it until it was perfect. But what I thought even more amazing was, if the gun he had just restored was supposed to be a cased gun and he had a label, he then made a case for it, usually of brass and leather. Believe me, I saw a few – they were a work of art and a thing of beauty. These guns then either went to a show in Dallas or an auction in England. I think he passed away about thirty years ago. I feel privileged to have known Mr. Gatley.

*I attended the gun show held in Vernon this Labour Day weekend. It was very well run with an excellent venue and parking was more than sufficient. Attendance was steady and the folks who attended were there to buy.*

**OTTAWA – September 7, 2012** – *The Honourable Vic Toews, Canada's Minister of Public Safety, announced today the Government of Canada's intent to repeal the Gun Shows Regulations. The Government's proposal to repeal the Regulations will be published in the September 8, 2012 issue of the Canada Gazette. The Gun Shows Regulations were introduced in 1998 under the Firearms Act but have never come into force.*

*"Repealing the unnecessary Gun Shows Regulations shows our Government is focusing on protecting families and communities and not pushing administrative burdens on law-abiding gun owners," said Minister Toews. "We will continue to tackle crime by getting guns out of the hands of criminals and off our streets."*
