I forgot in the last newsletter to mention that the CMEC will be holding a gun show July 21 at the museum on the old CFB in Chilliwack. For more info call George at 604.841.0710.

Any of you folks who attended the Kamloops show are aware of how busy it was on Saturday. Some felt there were more visitors than last year. For me it was a huge crowd both years. I was too busy at the table to even think about the difference. I have to report again I was hungry at 11:30 a.m. but didn't have time to unwrap my sandwich until nearly 1 p.m. Eating lunch was getting a bite now and again. My stomach wasn't sure we had had any lunch and I couldn't get away to get coffee! I was very busy selling small stuff all weekend. I'd hoped to get rid of some bulky items and some heavy stuff. However, I brought them all home again. I wasn't able to get around all of the tables in fact I didn't see most of the tables. We are all wishing Mrs. Jim Cox a speedy recovery after her back operation.


I'm going to leave you with something my old Grandad used to say: "If your word ain't no good; you ain't no good."

Sauer und Sohn of Suhl, was purchased by the German military in limited quantities and issued during World War II. It had a 75mm barrel, was 146mm overall, and weighed 621 grams. It had a 7-shot magazine and the barrel was rifled 7 right. (*Krcma*)
