RON'S REPORT

Greetings again boys and girls. Here is breaking news – you've seen it here – another gun show at the CMEC Museum, September 29. And yet another November 30, a Saturday show to be held in the Cloverdale Legion. So if you would like to participate in either of these shows, give George a call at 604.841.0710.

The Lions sponsored a two-day event August 17-18 in the Ledger Avenue venue. This show turned out to be the largest and best attended show that they have put on so far. Every table on the floor was covered plus all six tables on the stage. There were certainly lots of very nice items offered for sale. This year we had two ladies offering small antiques for sale. I believe I heard they were doing quite well. Elder Jeske had a couple of tables so I asked him if his sales to himself had increased since the July show. He told me he was watching his spending this month so his sales to himself were down a bit from July. We were all glad to see Cliff Jahn back again behind his tables. We had heard and he confirmed he had been suffering poor health for the last while. I thought he looked good and I'm hoping he felt as good as he looked. We all missed him behind his tables on the stage. Mark Lewis was also back at his place on the stage. He had been caring for an aging grandmother. Welcome back you guys! Uncle Dave Worfolk showed me this most unusual rifle of the show. It was a Lee Enfield No. 1 MK111 that had been rebarrelled with a Winchester Model 70 barrel in 243 Win. A combination I don't think many people would expect. I forgot to say that, on door opening, it was a tidal wave of visitors just streaming in the door! I've seen big crowds come in before but I think this was the most people I've seen here. Of course there were lots that I recognise but there were certainly a very large percentage of new folks coming to see what we were about. A lot of the regular sellers don't have tables in August so many people taking tables were, shall we say, new blood. Although I didn't sell any guns, I sure saw a lot going out of the door to be bagged. Ed Krawinkel called Friday and had to cancel his table because of health issues. However, on Sunday he managed to come in and tell me he would be at the November 16-17 show. We all hope you're feeling fine soon, Ed. Back to Saturday. No one came to tell me they had a poor show and I'm guessing that a few folks had great shows. I didn't get a chance to ask the two ladies with antique tables how well they had done. They were both smiling most of the time so I expect they were doing okay. Al Olson came down from Lumby to do the show. Since he stayed at my house I didn't forget to ask how well he had made out. He told me that he paid for his tables, fuel and the dinner he treated me to on Friday night. He left happy.

Sunday as everyone knew was the famous Lions Breakfast Buffet. They surprised me by making it even better than last year. I hadn't thought that possible! My usual breakfast is two slices of toast. At the Lions breakfast I double that to four slices and a few grapes. Well, I was still full at lunch time and could only eat very lightly at noon. I noticed Al was eating no more than I was. Of course the crowd was lighter but steady all day. I saw guns leaving to be bagged. There were just fewer going out Sunday. Charlie Stewart came in Sunday to check out the show. I've spoken to him since and he seemed quite impressed with what he saw.

Back to Saturday, I almost forgot. Dawn and Catlyn Brown dropped in for a visit. Dawn was on vacation in July and said she missed us all and wanted to see us. So Catie thought she should visit us also. Another important visitor was the popular author of aircraft books; our own, Mike Wallace. He was on his way to the aircraft museum to introduce his latest book and, if I'm not mistaken, receive an award. Now how's that? Sunday again – I had two surprises. Rhonna came in to take reservations for the November 16-17 show. Before she left she said that she would buy her 50-50 tickets. Did I want her to get mine? Yes. So she left both with me and left. Since I've never had my name drawn for anything, I knew I'd made a donation. Later they announced the draw to be held. I didn't pay any attention as I just don't win things. Then all of a sudden three guys yelled at me to get up on the stage because I'd won! I looked over at Marion Cooper and she again called me up there. Sure enough, I won the 50-50 draw! My next surprise was that a man came up to the table and said, "Ron, remember me, Max Vekich. The last time we were together was in 1982 when I had dinner at your house." Well, I did remember so we caught up a little in 15 minutes but it was getting close to closing and he wanted to see the show. He said he would return in September and join the Club. Volcanic Repeater.

The Volcanic Repeater and the Volcanic Rifle. The Volcanic Repeater is a very important gun in history, if relatively obscure. Based on the unsuccessful Volcanic Rifle, this was a lever-action pistol designed for target shooting. At the time, all other pistols were black powder. A joint venture led to the creation. The Jennings Rifle Company had Horace Smith and Daniel Wesson working for them, and they teamed up on this pistol. This led to the partnership of Smith and Wesson a year later in 1854. Wesson also wanted to use a modified Flobert cartridge, a patent of a rimfire metallic cartridge. The modification led to the creation of the .22 rimfire. One of the world's largest gun companies and the world's most popular cartridge are here because of this obscure pistol. It was manufactured starting in 1853 in .22RF, and .31 and .41 caliber, but these were unpopular due to their unreliability.
