RON'S REPORT

We had a couple of members displaying items and uniforms from the US Civil War. That's something I haven't seen around now for years. Also, naturally there were all kinds of military weapons. Swords and bayonets were popular as were the fighting knives. I often wonder what happened to all of this kind of stuff after the then collectors of it lost interest and changed interests.

In those days the show opened about noon on Saturday and was open until about 10 p.m. Sunday was 9 a.m. to about 5 p.m. Then you had to pack up your trade tables and also your display. Bedtime became quite late and the next morning too early. It took at least a week to get over most shows because you worked like a dray horse getting the stuff to the show site, you didn't get much time to eat and certainly very little sleep. Then you had it all to pack up and take home. It's a good thing we were all a lot younger then. I'm not sure I could do it now! Now that was our shows here and Victoria. In Alberta and Saskatchewan the shows were bigger and the travelling took longer. In those shows their custom was to drink stuff carried in paper bags that seemed to make most of them laugh a lot. Of course, some became very bad tempered as well. There was one gentleman at a Calgary show, he had two tables of 1873 Winchesters on display, a really nice showing. Anyhow, he had so much out of his paper bag that at the end of the show he forgot his guns and just went home. Lucky for him a friend noticed what had happened and packed up his guns and took them home for him. I never could see any sense in that behaviour. I was always having a good time without the paper bag. After all, I was at a gun show! I still feel that way about shows. Anyhow, that was the reason we banned drinking a long time ago in our shows.

Does anyone remember Ray Baker? He was a Winchester collector in a wheelchair. He was also very artistic and used

to paint the signs for our shows. Well, I still have one of the signs Ray painted.

I saw this information on a car in Chilliwack: "Grandma's the name and spoiling's the game."

I've just read in the latest "Access to Firearms" that "Son of Daddy" and his Liberal followers plan to introduce some more gun control laws soon. It seems they haven't noticed yet that criminals DON'T obey gun laws!

We have all learned from Einstein, "The mark of an idiot is someone who repeatedly makes the same mistake but expects a different result." Do you agree?

I thought it was temporary because of the shopping centers. Oh no! It turned out there was a serious accident at 244 Street. It took nearly an hour to get there. It seems a car had rammed about two feet into the back of a minivan. I heard later three people were taken away by ambulance. I'm guessing the rear car's driver was doing something on his phone.

The other night on the TV news they showed 10 jurisdictions and their penalties for distracted driving. All were a lot stricter than ours. I've seen lots of people on their phone on city streets as I walk around.

Now the show. It turned out to be slower than I expected. We had 200 pay admission. Anyone I've spoken to since has remarked about slow sales. That's with one exception. First of all, sales were slow. Then there were lots who came by and asked prices on various items. When I quoted a price, they offered 40% less. Of course I said NO! They just walked away. No, I didn't swear at any of them. I didn't recognize any of them either. So, you're waiting for this. No! I didn't sell any of the three guns I displayed. However, one man looked at the mint Winchester shotgun I brought.

So boys and girls, I think I've said enough for now. Maybe next time I'll have good news, like I sold a gun in November. As in the past, there won't be a December newsletter so I will take this opportunity to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and the best of the season.
